Huge credit must go to the Urlingford half-back line of Oisín Sweetman, Dara Hickey and Conal Lyng, who won every breaking ball and launched wave after wave of attacks. Deep into injury time, Padraig Bourke broke a tackle and fed Gibbons, who was fouled 13 metres out. Facing five Piltown players on the line, he unleashed an incredible strike into the top corner—an unforgettable moment that levelled the game. The goal sparked wild celebrations, the Urlingford supporters exploding with excitement as the impossible suddenly became real. Seconds later, the whistle sounded. Extra time awaited the score 2-4 apiece.

Urlingford carried the momentum into extra time, with Gibbons flawless from placed balls. Just before the break, Paudie Power reacted quickest to fist home a dropping ball, giving Urlingford a four-point lead. Early in the second period, fourth-class star Tom Hickey produced a magical finish into the top corner to extend the lead further. With Will Bergin driving forward powerfully and adding a fine point, Urlingford pushed clear.

Piltown battled to the end, scoring 1-1 late on, but Urlingford held firm to win 3-6 to 2-5 after a thrilling contest. They now look forward to a county final against Rower Inistioge, with date and venue to be confirmed.
